

Dress Code Policy

At the School Council meeting last term, council endorsed the Moorine Rock Primary School Dress Code policy. A copy of this was emailed out and is available on our website.

The policy is effective from this term. There is flexibility for students to wear clothing items that are not in the policy which they are currently wearing (e.g. hats without logos), however it is expected by 2019 every student is in the uniform as stated in the policy. In 2020, there will be a transition to the new cool-wick t-shirt.

Other changes to the policy include the addition of a green skort with yellow piping and a green and yellow panel dress, replacing the current white and green check dress. Please contact Amanda Eiffler if you require uniforms.

NAIDOC Day

NAIDOC Week is from 8-15th July, and as these dates are during the school holidays, we will be recognising NAIDOC Week on Thursday 19th July. The theme of NAIDOC week this year is 'Because of Her, We Can!', which focuses on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women who have played and continue to play an active and significant role in the community, and in local, state and national levels.

Their food was heavier then grams.


Then we saw the birds
