SPECIAL EVENTS

On special event days (school photo day, excursions etc), students are required to wear the sports bottle green with yellow panel t-shirt and bottle green bottoms (shorts, pants, skorts) and green/yellow sports jacket.

FOOTWEAR

Footwear should cater for Physical Education activities as well as activities undertaken during recess and lunch times. We encourage students to wear fully enclosed school shoes, sports shoes/sandshoes. Thongs, boots, sandals and uggboots are all unacceptable.

HATS

Students are expected to wear MRPS Logo wide brimmed hat when outside for recess and lunch times, excursions and in Physical Education activities.

EARRINGS

Students are not to wear earrings which could be considered a safety issue. The only acceptable earrings are studs or hoops which are sufficiently small that they cannot be accidentally torn from the ear.

BODY PIERCING

Body jewellery other than in the ears is discouraged. Should a student undertake to have piercing through places other than ears, there will be a need to ensure that Occupational Health and Safety issues are addressed. Student will be asked to remove or cover protruding jewellery that could be caught on clothing or pose a danger or threat to a child during school activities. Students who cannot comply with that instruction will be able to observe a lesson, but will not be able to participate.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Denim jeans of any colour (as per the education act), beanies, singlets, scarves, bandannas, jeggings, long sleeved tees or jumpers with/without hoods under the school polo shirt that aren't green/grey/white/black, tights/leggings that aren't green as well as tights/leggings/bike shorts worn without dress or skort.

EXEMPTIONS

The Principal may exempt students from the School Dress Code upon written request from their parents or caregivers.

Grounds on which exemption may be sought include:

- Religious
- Cultural or ethnic
- Itinerant students
- Genuine medical sickness

The support you can give as a parent is to ensure that your child is equipped with full school uniform; including a jumper or jacket in Winter.

To ensure the safety of all students when they are away from school property, it is school policy that only students in school uniform may attend excursions; unless otherwise organised. Students out of uniform on the day of the excursion will remain at school with appropriate work.

Please note that if you/parent are experiencing financial hardship and needs some support from the school in purchasing a school uniform for their child, you are very welcome to contact the school for this support.

POLICY REVIEW AND MAINTANENCE

- The **School Dress Code Policy** will have input from the school community through the School Council
- The policy will have input from the students through the Student Council
- The policy will be reviewed at regular intervals
- The School will promote the policy through newsletter items and assembly items
- The administration will allocate time to review and maintain the policy

This course of action has been endorsed by the School Council and school staff as a means of ensuring that the focus of students, at the school, remains one of academic success.
