Students participated in collaborative teamwork tasks designed to test their teamwork, collaboration and communication skills. 

Did You Know?

Did you know that Moorine Rock School opened on 8th June 1926? A railway cottage was utilised as a temporary school, the cottage providing accommodation for teacher Miss B Armstrong. Ten students were enrolled. The cottage served as a school for ten years. In 1937 the Rocky Gully school building was moved to Moorine and re-erected on the present school grounds; it is still in use today. By this stage school numbers had crept up to forty and two teachers were needed. But the depression followed by war impacted on student numbers. In 1942 the de-licensed Moorine hotel was turned into a temporary convent and school. billeting students from Highgate School until all threat of bombs on Perth had passed. Consolidation of schools reared its head during the war years due lack of teachers. It was considered that several schools in Yilgarn be closed and children bussed to Southern Cross. But Moorine parents were against closure. Despite several attempts at amalgamation since, Moorine school is still going strong.
