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

We have reached the end of term and it has certainly arrived quickly. Happy Easter to everyone and enjoy the break.

Science – The juniors have finished their model environment and have planned and designed their alien that has the features to survive where they crashed. This week they will build the alien and complete an annotated diagram and fact sheet. The seniors have almost finished their model habitat however we had a problem with the modelling clay which interrupted production. This allowed time to introduce the students to the 'ShowMe' app on their Ipads so they could show and discuss the food web of their habitat. This week the 3D habitats should be completed so next term they can design and present the information and relationships within their habitat on their choice of media.



PE – The end of term has been about basketball, particularly ball handling skills and developing fast foot work. Shooting and game techniques will be the focus for the next few weeks.

Indonesian – The 5/6's have discovered the different names for foods in Indonesian and are learning about food markets and rupiah. The 3/4's have made a paper puppet and will write a conversation in Indonesian for a puppet show.
