Dear Parents and Guardians,

COVID-19 Update

Yesterday, the Premier announced Level 2 public health measures which will come into effect on Thursday 3 March. They include the requirement for adults and children in Years 3 and above to wear masks at all indoor public settings.

This means our students in Year 3 and above will now need to wear a mask indoors at school. The usual exemptions apply, such as removing the mask to eat, drink, take medicine or while doing vigorous exercise.

You may wish to speak to your child about wearing a mask, and that their friends will also be wearing them. Wearing masks in the classroom will help to reduce the spread of the virus. If your child is in Kindergarten to Year 2, you may wish to let them know that they will see other children around the school wearing a mask, just like their teacher does. Our staff will continue to explain to our students the importance of wearing a mask to support each other and help keep our community safe.

Parents are required to provide their child with masks for their school days. We have a small number of child's masks on hand but they are for emergencies only.
