Students gain Lexile points by completing their home reading and taking an online quiz to check their comprehension of their book. Students are then awarded points based on the complexity of their book. I will send a letter home to the eligible students closer to the date with more information. Students will not need lunch on this day. This term we will be taking eligible students to the Moorine Rock Hotel for lunch.



Greeting from the Senior Room

The past fortnight has seen students in the Senior Room getting stuck into some solid learning. In Literacy we have been continuing our focus on narrative (story) writing as well as looking at using speech marks and verbs. Below is a picture of the story writing template students are learning to use in planning their stories. It give them a clear structure around which to plan, helps them develop key parts of their stories and stops their stories from turning into the script for a movie.



It starts with a sizzling start to draw the readers in, followed by filling in the stories background. Then the tension is built till the hero can do nothing but fail, until the action climax and the happily ever after.

Our focus on reading also continues with reading activities each day, including, text study, reading for expression and lexile reading. I am also reading from a novel to the students every day. Reading is a key underpinning of all literacy learning and supports, spelling, speaking, writing, vocabulary and grammar. This is why we put a big emphasis on home reading and are trying to encourage all students to spend some time each day with their heads in books.

Below is students progress on this terms Lexile challenge. Students need 20 Lexile points and 40 nights of reading to attend our Lexile lunch in week 10.

Finally, as you are all unable to come into the classroom at present, I include a picture of some art created with Ms Suttie and our classroom expected behaviour poster.






