Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Guardians

Thank you to the School Community for a warm welcome. It has been lovely getting to know the students, and I am thoroughly enjoying being back in the Wheatbelt. Yesterday afternoon, the School Council met. Topics of discussion included the National Quality Standard, School Development Days for 2023, Contributions and Charges and Booklists, the end of year concert and staffing for next year.

Currently, Josie and I are planning for next year and to do this we need to know our projected numbers. If you child/ren are not returning to Moorine Rock next year, can you please let me know by Monday, 7 November either in writing or in person.

The School Development Days for 2023 are 30 and 31 January, 6 June, 28 August, 9 October and 15 December. PP-Year 6 students return to school on **Wednesday**, **1 February** and Kindergarten students begin on **Thursday**, **2 February**.

STEM Day Lunch

Thank you to The Yilgarn Shire for supplying lunch for students at our combined STEM Day. School lunches from the shop **will not be available this week.** If your child does not like a sausage sizzle for lunch, please supply something else for your child to eat on this day. Stationary Items

Booklist for students will be sent out in the next couple of weeks. We are using Nextra News again in Merredin. Josie will drop the orders off and pick them up for you. Orders need to be in by 21st November and once Nextra News has completed the orders she will pick them all up. You may also wish to drop your child/rens order off at Netxra News directly when it is convenient for you or you are welcome to purchase your booklists from another supplier. Nextra News has not yet decided what the prize will be for the lucky parent that purchases their booklist supplies from Nextra News. Teachers will be sending home in the next couple of weeks the extra supplies that the students have not used in 2022. This will enable you to only order the booklist supplies that are needed.

COVID Update

You may be aware that COVID isolation is no longer mandatory. However, to reduce the risk to others it is recommended that staff and students:

- ·stay home until symptoms have resolved. The infectious period for COVID-19 varies. A minimum of 5 days is a useful guide, but it can be 10 days or longer
- ·register RAT results
- ·if you must leave the house, wear a mask when indoors and on public transport
- · avoid large gatherings and indoor crowded places

Attendance

Last semester, we had **53.8%** of our students attend school regularly (more than 90% of the time) and this semester, we are currently sitting at **45.5%** of our students attending regularly.

Statistics show that attendance below 90% places a child <u>AT RISK</u> of not achieving their educational potential. Did you know that **missing half a day of school each week** equates to one month of missed learning opportunities and **missing half a day of school each week between Pre-primary and Year 10**, equates to missing almost one full year of learning? As you can see, it is important that students attend school on a regular basis.






