### FROM OUR SENIOR ROOM WITH MS MELIS

Students in the senior room have been learning about Australian emblems and symbols, along with heat energy and its different sources. We have been learning about mindfulness and how having a growth mindset can help us improve our work and to become more positive. We have started an inquiry learning program in Technologies which will be looking at Aboriginal connections to Country and our own connections to the place we call home.

Each morning students in both the Junior and Senior rooms have been practising for the Cross Country and in sport we are learning to follow directions, based on being Pirates. In science they learnt how to make a lava lamp and in the combined art class we have a focus on portraits, with students working on a self-portrait collage.

Please remember to have students complete their homework each day and then bring it to school every morning.

The students are loving our STEM projects each Monday afternoon.

We have been reading a different fairy tale each week and building something based on that fairy tale. Last week we read Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

After reading the book I asked the students what do you think we will be building? The last couple of weeks when we read the Three Billy Goats Gruff and the Three Little Pigs the students were able to guess straight away, a bridge and houses. This time it wasn't as obvious. Some guessed houses again, some guessed beds. The goal was to build a chair that could hold Goldilocks and a finger puppet Baby Bear and Mama Bear that had turned into a penguin because I couldn't find another bear.

The students do so well with these challenges and impress me with their designs each time. These kinds of challenges build critical thinking skills and teamwork. Some students choose to work on their own and come up with great ideas independently.

When they have finished, we all gather around and predict whether or not the chair will hold all three characters and why or why not.

Then we test it!





We have been playing lots of games this week in between working very hard.

They are loving the Jack and the Bean Stalk game and the new activity 'See and Solve Kit' that is a fun way to practice addition and subtraction.

We have been focussing on different types of measurement in maths. We measured how tall everyone in the class is and talked about who is the tallest, who is the shortest and if anyone is the same height.

We also started doing information reports on animals, we learnt so many facts about crocodiles.



In Health we learnt words that can express how we feel when we feel safe. The students drew pictures of places where they feel safe and had to write why they feel safe there. This helps them identify feelings of safety and the opposite of feeling unsafe and uncomfortable.

Students came up with words like calm, happy, relaxed, warm.



I can't believe it is already week five! This term is going so quickly, we are so busy in class doing lots of learning every day. Looking forward to the next five weeks being just as great!
