FROM OUR SENIOR ROOM WITH MS MELIS

Senior Room

Welcome to Week 7. It feels like I have said this before, but "what a full-on couple of weeks we have had", again. Students in the senior room have been practicing their assembly item. We will be presenting a readers theatre, about Cinderella, with a twist. In Geography we have continued to learn about Australia and its unique features.

The whole school has been practicing every morning and on Friday afternoons for the interschool sports carnival which is happening this Friday. Some of our Senior students are quite competitive and we should put on a good show.

In combined Science we did an experiment called Neon Flowers, where we added food colouring and water into a cup and then placed our white flowers into the cups, to see if they would take on the colour of the dye. This was a successful experiment, with nearly all the flowers changing colours.



Now that the weather has warmed up a bit we have been getting outside more. The Kindy's and Pre Kindy's enjoyed playing in the sandpit this week. The seniors, pre-primaries and year ones have been seeing how deep they can dig at recess and lunch.







We tried to do bubble paintings, but they didn't work. The students didn't seem to mind, they just had fun blowing bubbles. We will try again one day with paint instead of food dye and see if it works better.











Each Thursday morning when Miss Glazier is with the Pre-Kindy's and Kindy's the Pre-Primaries and Year Ones have been working with Mrs Capelli.











The students have been loving the Geo boards the last couple of weeks.













We have a new station set up where students can look at Aboriginal symbols and trace them in coloured sand, their designs have been beautiful and it's great to see they can identify what their symbol means.







The Kindy's had a great time using shaving foam to trace letters, numbers and shapes before Mrs Capelli let them go wild with cars.









Miss Glazier has moved the class room around yet again and thinks she finally might be happy with it. Our construction area has been improved and the kids are loving it.
