I can't believe we are in the final term for this year. The Senior Room students have lots of exciting things happening this term. We will be doing a unit based around the book "How to train your Dragon, by Cressida Cowell". The story looks at relationships, empathy and overcoming obstacles. We are also learning about poetry and how musicians use poetry for writing their songs. Students will be choosing their favourite song and looking at all the poetic techniques used by the writer.

We have completed a STEAM challenge where students worked on "Create an Amazing Machine", based on the Rube Goldberg experiments, which required students to apply forces to make something perform an action.



For our homework this term we have a spelling workbook, with a set of weekly activities, which the students will be doing, along with their daily reading. In Maths, we are focussing on time and will also be working on remembering our multiplication tables.
