Extreme Heat Policy

I trust you are all surviving this heatwave which has certainly made it's presence within our Wheatbelt. MRPS lost power for a brief period yesterday around 2.40pm however it was quickly restored which the School Council and I were very grateful for! A very big thank you to Naomi Borona, Leah Lawrence and Ian Maddock for braving the heat to meet with us yesterday. Our classes have settled well this term despite the change in dynamics for the multi-age groups.

Extreme heat is a period of unusual and uncomfortable hot weather that can negatively affect health. Children and young people are more susceptible to heat stress. For this reason, MRPS staff recognise and respond to heat related illness and have strategies to manage the risks associated with extreme hot weather.

Schools do not close at a certain temperature threshold during days of extreme heat. A decision to close any school is made by the Deputy Director General of schools in consultation with the Director of Education. If as the Principal I hold concerns regarding the health and safety of staff and students, I will contact our Director of Education to consider appropriate measures.

Our Extreme Heat Policy is addressed on a daily basis whereby as Principal I direct actions for that given day. Students and staff are encouraged to remain hydrated, external blinds are closed and our air conditioners are working to capacity!

All our staff and students are to be commended for their patience and resilience during this time, hopefully a reprieve is in sight soon.

Roadworks Update




Thank You!!

We have been having lots of fun in the Junior room. We have great little bunch this year. We are practising our writing every day and it's amazing how quickly our Pre-Primaries are getting the hang of it. Our favourite song right now is Pevan and Sarah's pencil grip song! We have started our design and technology unit this week and learnt about the design and planning process. Students drew and labelled a dough nut they would like to make and then crafted it using paper plates and lots of different decorations representing the toppings.

The Kindy's have been doing lots of fun activities learning about letters and numbers – they loved tracing letters in the colourful sand with Miss Edis.

We also learnt about Japanese ink painting in visual art and how it is at least 700 years old! We did some amazing paintings using water colours of Popular Japanese painting subjects such as cats, bamboo, koi fish and cranes.

For Valentine's day we discussed how we can show people we care about them and things people do that make us feel loved. The students drew some lovely pictures of places, animals and things they love.











FROM OUR SENIOR ROOM WITH MISS HONG

Hello from the wonderful and joyful Senior room! Students are adjusting quite well to their routines, and I am very impressed with their recall and ability to take initiative when transitioning between both classes on DOTT days. I have been observing students helping each other out, whether it's carrying someone's laptop or reminding someone what goes into their large "tray." Seniors are well into their learning with Ibu Pearl this year for Indonesian and I am happy to hear all students participating and trying their best. We have a lot going on, especially as we start new units. For Science, Year 2s are focusing on Earth's resources, Year 4 is learning about the Earth's surface, and Year 5 has started the Solar System. Who remembers the mnemonic device used to learn the order of the planets?

Students have also started new History units, with Year 2s focusing on learning about the past, Year 4 is diving into pre-contact of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, and Year 5 is learning about the development of Australian colonies.

Regarding assessments, I have completed placements for Year 4/5 Spelling Mastery and next week I will be conducting the Ballard Westwood assessment for all students (maths). NAPLAN is on the radar as well and we have one student writing the exam this year in March.
