In science we are continuing to learn about living things. Last week we compared gummy worms to earth worms. We made Venn Diagrams describing similarities and differences. The students decided the most important difference was that gummy worms are yummy and Earth worms are not! When the students finished their Venn Diagram they were allowed to eat the gummy worm.

To follow on from using stop motion last term we made flick books in STEM. The students loved being able to make their pictures come to life.

It is National Simultaneous Story time this week. We will be reading ''Bower bird blues'' We started learning about Bower birds last week and even built a bower together. The students have been collecting blue '' treasures'' to decorate the bower.

Last week we wrapped up the Mother's Day festivities. Thank you to our Year 4/5 students for making the salt dough that was used for the Mother's Day craft. They worked independently and followed the recipe. All students had a great time making their picture frames and crafting special cards for Mums/Nannas. I am so proud of the love and care they put into everything. The Senior students also did a fabulous job baking cupcakes for the Mums to decorate. Last week in tech, we started to build conveyer belts, and we have been discussing their purpose, where we find them, and their function. Many students were able to draw connections to their own farms and grocery stores.

This week, our school is participating in the National Simultaneous Storytime on Wednesday, and the chosen book is titled Bowerbird Blues. To prepare for this, the whole school constructed nests in the yard using blue objects to attract the bird's mate.





#### Claim now

You can submit a claim:

- on the ServiceWA app on your mobile phone
- · online
- by filling out and posting in a paper form
- asking for help at your school.

#### You will need:

 The 8-digit WA student number (WASN) for each student.

#### You'll find it on:

- school reports.
- previous NAPLAN results
- secondary student's SmortRider

If you have trouble locating the number, contact your school for help.

- Details of each student you are claiming for:
- name at time of enrolment
- date of birth
- school name
- year level.
- The details of your bank account where the payment will be deposited.




