Senior students had a stimulating and engaging time learning about the purpose, importance, and function of opposable thumbs in science. Students experimented timing themselves doing a variety of tasks (taking their shoes on and off, cutting paper, opening objects, writing). Once they completed the initial test, I taped their thumb and index finger together (thereby removing mobility of their thumbs). Students had to repeat their experiment and tasks, which proved challenging for all! Thumbthing tells me they have a new appreciation for their thumbs.


In design, students have wrapped up making their conveyor belts, with many running into engineering challenges which required them to work as a team and problem solve. An important takeaway lesson is that we never start from scratch in engineering, rather we build off one another and troubleshoot throughout the whole process. It was wonderful to see students sharing their solutions.

Students were sad to say goodbye to our TAFE student, Tayla. She has been completing her Education Assistant hours with us for the last two weeks. It has been lovely to see her support students in all subjects, especially maths and science. 
