

### FROM OUR JUNIOR ROOM WITH MISS GLAZIER

In the junior room we have been learning about forces in science. The kindy's experimented with using different force to throw at a target and paint it. The Juniors learnt about friction by testing how far cars can travel on different surfaces. We figured out it's not a fair test unless we use the same car on every surface because different cars have different wheels. Pre Kindy's had fun doing a flower pot craft but their favourite thing is using play dough every Thursday morning.









## FROM OUR SENIOR ROOM WITH MS HONG

Senior students recently engaged in an experiment where they attempted to separate two interlocked books, only to discover that the increased friction made it nearly impossible. The Year 2 students wrapped up their hands-on project by testing their toy car launchers, measuring how far the cars travelled across various surfaces. Last week, we also took our math lessons outdoors, giving students the opportunity to explore 2D and 3D shapes in a real-world context as part of our geometry unit. It's been an exciting time of discovery and learning!

## PIE WARMER LUNCHES

## Bus safety tips

#### Whenever you and your child are travelling on a bus, be a good role model.

- Consider other passengers and the driver and respect their right to have a safe trip.
- If the bus has seat belts use them!
- Keep your belongings out of the way of others. Keep your bag on your lap or under the seat
- Stay in your seat while the bus is moving.
- Keep your feet off the seats and your arms and legs inside the bus.
- Keep noise to a minimum and don't distract the driver.
- Wait for the bus to stop and then get off without pushing or shoving.
- Wait for the bus to leave before trying to cross the road. Always remember to Stop, Look, Listen and Think before you cross the road.

Identify separate play space for children and no go zones for vehicles. Clearly communicate these zones to children, families, and visitors. Consider reversing machinery into sheds.








