FROM OUR JUNIOR ROOM WITH MISS GLAZIER

Hot weather calls for ice play! The Pre-Kindy's and Kindy's enjoyed breaking open big ice blocks and experimenting with colours on the ice. We love seeing them engaging in play and learning how to work together, negotiate, solve problems and be creative!

In science we have been learning about forces like gravity and push and pull forces. We finished this unit by making some Fairy Bread. The students had to think about every time they used a push or pull movement when opening lids, spreading butter, cutting the bread etc. We even realised they were using a force when pushing the fairy bread into their mouths. Finishing up the physical science unit means we are now moving onto chemical science. We will be doing lots of fun experiments in the coming weeks.

World Teacher's Day was such a treat! It was so special to see the community come together to celebrate us. We are so grateful for having such a kind and supportive parent community surrounding us.







In the past few weeks, our students have been engaged in hands-on learning through various creative projects. They enjoyed making baskets to explore how plant fibres were traditionally woven into baskets, gaining insight into cultural practices.

In science, students made lava lamps, discovering how oil and water don't mix due to their different densities, and when mixed with baking soda and vinegar, gas bubbles rise, creating a mesmerizing effect. Our STEAM challenges have been a hit! From building stable houses strong enough to withstand the wolf's sneeze (my blow dryer) to designing creative projects from recycled materials. Students are learning to problem-solve and think critically.

Point Peron Camp Year 4 and 5

Our recent camp in Week 2 from Tuesday to Friday at Point Peron was an exciting adventure, made even better by the beautiful weather and a fun journey on the Prospector train! We teamed up with students from Meckering for a range of activities, including crate climbing, where students worked together to help their peers climb as high as possible while safely harnessed. Raft building was another highlight, as students learned various knots and worked in teams to build rafts, which they then tested on the ocean. They also enjoyed trying their hand at archery, practicing focus and precision, along with bush walking and beach challenges, all while strengthening teamwork and building lasting friendships.

I'm incredibly proud of my Year 4/5s for embodying our Moorine Rock values throughout camp. They embraced the opportunity to connect with new friends, take on fresh challenges, and, most importantly, had an amazing time while doing so. A big thank you to the P&C for their generous support in covering the cost of camp. Their contribution made it possible for our students to enjoy this wonderful experience at Point Peron!

We had to undo all our hard work on the shore by pulling apart what was left of our raft. The ropes and tyres had to be separated and put back into the shed. This was a competition and we won!


Dustin (Yr4)
