#### Dear Parents and Guardians,

What a fantastic term it's been so far! Our Kindergarten to Year 2 students have shown wonderful growth, resilience, and enthusiasm for learning. Here's a quick look at what we've been up to and what's coming next.

#### Literacy Corner

In literacy, our Kindergarten students have been enjoying their language awareness lessons and the associated craft activities, which help them explore rhyme and rhyme production in a fun and meaningful way. Pre-Primary students are using their phonics knowledge to write simple sentences and are becoming more confident with high-frequency words. Year 1 and 2 students have been learning about story structure and writing their own imaginative narratives, while also building reading fluency and comprehension skills during group sessions.



Our junior students have been practising pre-writing patterns!

#### Math Corner

In Mathematics, we've been developing number confidence across the year levels. Kindergarten students are learning to count, sort and compare objects, while Pre-Primary students are exploring simple addition and number formation. Year 1 and 2 students have been working on addition and subtraction strategies and are now beginning to investigate multiplication through equal groups and arrays.

#### Looking forward

With a few weeks left, we're excited to soak up every learning moment and celebrate all we've achieved! We thoroughly enjoyed participating in the Cross-Country Fun Run – all that practise during our PE lessons really paid off, and the students showed great effort and determination. The Junior Room will be hosting the assembly on Thursday, 26 June, and we warmly invite all families to join us.

### **Senior Room with Mrs Laczak-Goncalves**

The senior class recently took part in a football clinic that was both educational and enjoyable. The session was filled with various activities, including skill drills, mini-games, and team-building exercises, all aimed at enhancing their understanding and love for the game. It was a memorable experience that brought the class closer together and left everyone feeling more confident and connected on the field.



As part of their exploration of Earth and the solar system, students transformed their reading corner into an engaging reading nook that beautifully blended science and art. They crafted papier-mâché models of the planets, carefully shaping and painting each one. They also added their own drawings and paintings of celestial bodies, creating an immersive environment that sparked curiosity and encouraged further reading about the cosmos.

During our literacy block, the senior class has been diving into Roald Dahl's *Matilda*, using the novel as a springboard to enhance their grammar, reading comprehension, and writing skills. To further enrich their engagement with *Matilda*, the senior students undertook a creative project: rewriting Chapter 3, "The Hat and the Superglue," using a book template. This hands-on approach not only reinforced their literacy skills but also fostered creativity and a deeper connection to the story.

By logging their reading activities, students not only enhance their literacy skills but also have the opportunity to win exciting weekly prizes such as tech gadgets and book vouchers.
