Professional Learning

Over the past four weeks, our staff have been taking part in *Sounds Write* professional learning - spending one day each week building their skills and completing assessments in this evidence-based phonics program. Next week is the final day of training, after which staff will complete ongoing learning as required.

Once final assessments have taken place, every current member of our team will be fully qualified to teach *Sounds Write* across the whole school. This means they will all be using the same approach to support students with their reading and spelling, giving them strong and consistent foundations for literacy success.

We're really excited about the difference this will make for our students, and we look forward to sharing more with you as we put this learning into action!

Principal's Message


Attendance

Now that we're heading into the second half of the term (and hopefully past the worst of cold and flu season!), I'm really looking forward to seeing student attendance bounce back. We know there are often good reasons why children may need to stay home but every day at school really does make a difference - children build their confidence, strengthen friendships, and keep their learning on track when they attend regularly.

We love to celebrate great attendance, and here's how schools generally view it:

- 90-100% Regular and on track
- 80-89% At Risk Needs a little boost
- 60-79% High Risk Missing quite a bit of learning
- **0–59% Severe Risk** Missing a lot of school time

Out of interest this is a visual of where we are at following the first 5 weeks of this term and I'm hoping we can increase the blue, or Regular, attendance figure by the end of the term.



In the meantime, thank you for everything you do to help your child be here each day. Your support makes a huge difference, and we're excited to keep building positive learning experiences together.

We've had a wonderful start to the term, with students settling in quickly and engaging enthusiastically in their learning. It's been fantastic to see their energy, focus, and curiosity shining through as we dive into new routines and activities. The strong start sets us up for an exciting and productive term ahead!

Literacy Corner

Our Kindy to Year 2 students have made a fantastic start in Literacy this term! Kindergarten children are building strong foundations through phonemic awareness activities, exploring sounds and rhyme repetition. Pre-Primary students are developing their early reading and writing skills, focusing on blending and segmenting words, while also enjoying shared stories that spark their imagination. In Years 1 and 2, students are extending their knowledge of phonics and spelling patterns, working on fluency in reading, and beginning to apply comprehension strategies to understand texts in greater depth.



Math Corner

In Maths, our Kindy to Year 2 students are exploring number sense, patterns, and problem-solving. They are building confidence with counting, place value, and simple operations, while also learning to apply their skills in practical, hands-on activities.

Term Oview

Ilt has been a busy term already, with students enjoying wonderful events such as NAIDOC Day and Book Week. The excitement doesn't stop there—we still have Literacy Day, the Athletics Carnival, our Book Fair, Father's Day celebrations, and the Yilarn Show to look forward to. 




Senior Room with Mrs Laczak-Goncalves
