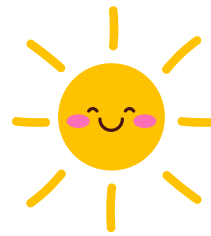
Our Learning

Literacy Corner

In Literacy this term, students continued to build strong foundations in reading and writing. They developed their phonics knowledge by learning new letter-sound relationships and applying these skills to blend, segment, and decode words with increasing confidence. They also strengthened their writing by using their growing knowledge of sounds and high-frequency words to record their ideas.

Throughout the term, we explored *A Year on Our Farm* by Penny Matthews and Andrew McLean. The text sparked meaningful discussions as students eagerly shared their own farming experiences, building vocabulary, making connections, and teaching me a little about farm life along the way.

It has been a pleasure to see students grow in confidence and enjoyment of literacy this term.



Math Corner

In Mathematics this term, students continued to strengthen their number knowledge, explore patterns, and develop problem-solving skills through a range of engaging learning experiences.

Students were encouraged to explain their thinking, and it has been lovely to see their confidence grow as more students have been willing to have a go, share their ideas, and take on new challenges.

English



In Literacy this term, we have been studying Kensuke's Kingdom, which has provided many opportunities to develop both sentence-level and whole-text writing skills. The students have written thoughtful letters to Michael, created survival checklists using the events from the novel, and explored a range of persuasive writing techniques. As part of our learning, we discussed the important issue of deforestation and used persuasive language and literacy strategies to write convincing arguments, supporting our opinions with reasons and evidence. It has been wonderful to see the students grow in confidence as writers while making meaningful connections to the themes in the novel.

Science



In Science, we delved deeper into our study of the Solar System, exploring the unique features of the planets, moons, asteroids, and comets, and developing a greater understanding of our place in space. The students consolidated their learning by taking part in our end-of-term production, Solar System Saga, where they confidently showcased their knowledge through acting, narration, and performance. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm, teamwork, and creativity shine on stage, and we are incredibly proud of the effort they put into making the performance such a success.

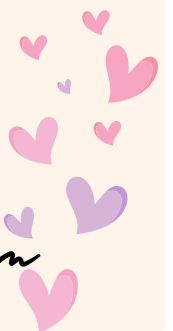
Watching them grow in confidence, knowledge, and character has been a true privilege.
